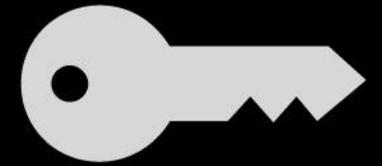

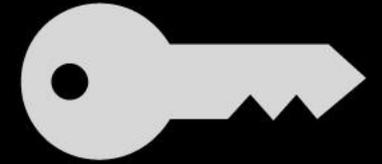
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How will I learn?

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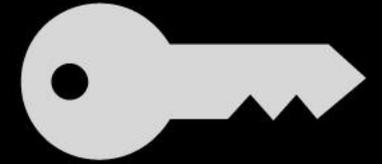
Terminology used within your answers

Identify - This would encourage to you complete a list or bullet points within your answer.

Explain - This answer would need to be more than a sentence. A small paragraph which has allowed you to demonstrate your understanding, with some clear reasons within your answer.

Describe - This answer will need to be more than a sentence. You will be expected to write a short paragraph which fully describes the point you are trying to make.

Summarise - This answer will need more than just a sentence. You will be expected to write a paragraph or overview of the main text.



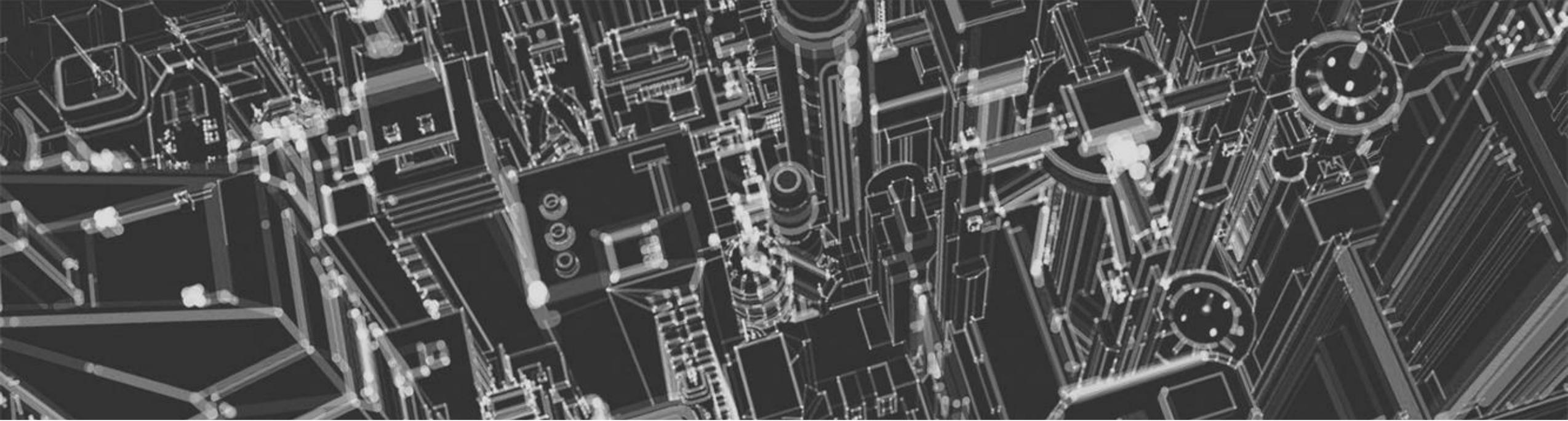

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What is harassment

Harassment is classed as someone is subjected to unwanted behaviour that makes you feel intimidated or humiliated. You may also find this behaviour to be offensive.

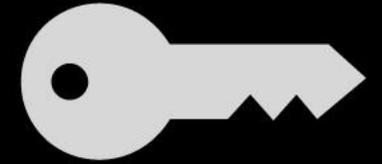
Harassment can happen on its own, or it is often found to be connected to one or more of the 9 protected characteristics under the Equality Act 2010. We learnt about these in unit 1. Before you click Next, write these down and see how many you can remember.

What is bullying

Bullying is known to be when either an individual or a group seek to cause harm, intimidate and coerce someone who is perceived to be vulnerable - [Protecting children from bullying and cyberbullying | NSPCC Learning](#)

Bullying can take place anywhere, at home, at school or college, and more recently on-line even playing computer games!

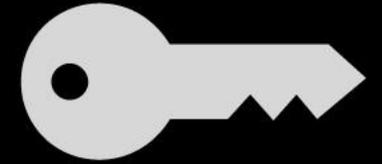
Bullying has a mixture of behaviours or actions that can contribute to the individual to feel they are being bullied.

1. Verbal: Name calling and being unkind about them as a person or their family.
2. Physical: Hitting or pushing the individual.
3. Emotional: Making threats towards them or their family, undermining them, isolating them others.

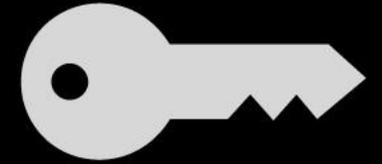


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What will I learn in this unit?

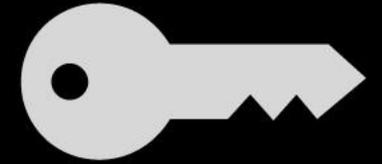


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Bullying and Harassment policy

In many organisations, your bullying and harassment policy will be found on your internal internet, or you may need to speak to your line manager or Human Resources department.

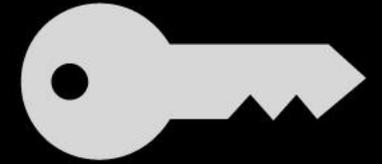
Activity

4. What you should do if you feel you are being bullied or harassed.
